

EPILEPSY FACTS AND STATS

- AROUND 270,000 AUSTRALIANS CURRENTLY LIVE WITH EPILEPSY (ONE PERCENT OF THE AUSTRALIAN POPULATION).
- 1 IN 25 AUSTRALIANS WILL BE DIAGNOSED WITH EPILEPSY IN THEIR LIFETIME.
- 1 IN 200 CHILDREN LIVE WITH EPILEPSY.
- EPILEPSY IS THE SECOND MOST COMMON NEUROLOGICAL CONDITION, AFTER DEMENTIA, MAKING IT MORE COMMON THAN PARKINSON'S DISEASE, MULTIPLE SCLEROSIS, MOTOR NEURONE DISEASE AND CEREBRAL PALSY.
- APPROXIMATELY **22 PERCENT** OF PEOPLE WITH EPILEPSY ALSO HAVE AN INTELLECTUAL DISABILITY.
- THE EXACT CAUSE OF EPILEPSY IS UNKNOWN IN APPROXIMATELY

 50 PERCENT OF PEOPLE LIVING WITH THE DISORDER.
- AROUND **70 PERCENT** OF PEOPLE LIVING WITH EPILEPSY CAN SUCCESSFULLY MANAGE SEIZURE ACTIVITY THROUGH ANTI-EPILEPTIC DRUGS, WHILE THE REMAINING **30 PERCENT** DO NOT GAIN CONTROL THROUGH MEDICATION.
- IN AUSTRALIA, EPILEPSY CAUSES APPROXIMATELY 300 DEATHS PER YEAR.
